7	CALL TO ORDER
8	Supervisor Stoneburner called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.
9	Supervisor Stoneourner caned the meeting to order at 7.50 p.m.
10	ROLL CALL
11	Members present: Clerk DeVries, Supervisor Stoneburner, Treasurer McGuire, Trustee Grundy
12	and Trustee Goebel.
13	Members absent: None.
14	There were approximately 50 other interested persons present.
15	
16	PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE - All present stood for the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the
17	United States of America.
18	
19	APPROVAL OF AGENDA
20	The agenda was reviewed. It was moved by Trustee Goebel, seconded by Trusty Grundy, to
21	approve the agenda as presented. The motion passed unanimously.
22	
23	CORRESPONDENCE
24	Supervisor Stoneburner indicated that there was no correspondence except for correspondence
25 26	pertaining to the matter scheduled for public hearing at this evening's meeting, which correspondence would be reviewed when the Board came to that agenda item.

28	PUBLIC COMMENT
29	There was no public comment.
30	
31	PINE LAKE AQUATIC PLANT CONTROL PROJECT
32	Supervisor Stoneburner indicated that the next item of business was consideration of the plans
33	for an aquatic plant control project within the proposed PINE LAKE AQUATIC PLANT
34	CONTROL PROJECT SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 12-1, the estimate of costs for
35	the project, the special assessment district proposed to be created for the recovery of such costs
36	and the petitions for the same.
37	
38	Clerk DeVries reported that proper Notice of Hearing on these matters had been published in the
39	Hastings Banner on December 20, 2012 and December 27, 2012, and had been mailed by
40	first-class mail to each property owner within the proposed special assessment district as
41	required by statute. Affidavits of the publication and mailing of these notices are on file with the
42	Township Clerk.
43	

- 44 Supervisor Stoneburner noted that Mr. Andy Tomaszewski of PLM Lake and Land Management,
- 45 Mr. Jay Wesley of the MDNR and Township Attorney Ken Sparks were present with respect to

this matter. Supervisor Stoneburner then requested that the Township Attorney provide a brief
 legal overview of the special assessment proceedings.

3

4 The Township Attorney noted that these special assessment proceedings had been initiated as a result of petitions that were filed with the Township Board requesting the initiation of the special 5 assessment proceedings. It was indicated that petitions signed by the owners of 70.2% of the 6 land area in the proposed special assessment district had been filed with the Township. It was 7 indicated that the proposed special assessment district consisted of all assessable properties in 8 9 Prairieville Township abutting Pine Lake or having deeded access to Pine Lake. The Township 10 Attorney indicated that plans had been prepared and were on file for the proposed 5 year aquatic plant control project. He indicated that a cost estimate was also on file and that the total 11 estimated cost of the project was \$227,135. He indicated that it was tentatively proposed that 12 there would be a special assessment of \$424.55 payable in annual installments of \$84.91 for lots 13 having Lake Frontage and that the special assessment would be one-half that amount for back 14 lots having deeded access. 15

16

The Township Attorney noted that this evening's public hearing was on the petitions for the project, the proposed special assessment district, the cost estimate and the plans for the project. He indicated that if this process proceeded further, there would then be a second public hearing

20 which would be on the proposed special assessment roll for the project.

21

The Township Attorney encouraged persons speaking during the public hearing to give their name for the record each time they speak. The Township Attorney indicated that if any persons present wished to object to the special assessment, they should feel free to do so. The Township Attorney noted that in order to preserve the right to appeal a special assessment to the Michigan Tax Tribunal, a property owner would need to make objection prior to the conclusion of the second public hearing on the special assessment.

29 The Supervisor then asked Mr. Tomaszewski to provide a brief summary of the proposed aquatic plant control project. Mr. Tomaszewski briefly reviewed the services provided by his company. 30 He indicated that his company had been contacted by persons residing on Pine Lake regarding a 31 continuing problem with Eurasian milfoil. He indicated that he and his company had been 32 involved with Pine Lake for approximately 8 years. He indicated that a lake survey taken by his 33 company showed that Eurasian milfoil was scattered throughout the lake. He indicated that the 34 proposed treatment program would consist of applying the chemical Sonar to the entire lake in 35 the spring of 2013. He indicated that it was anticipated that there would be a "bump-up" 36 treatment of Sonar approximately 21/2 weeks later. He indicated that the lake would then be 37 monitored and that it was anticipated that in the subsequent 4 years of the program there would 38 be spot treatments as needed using conventional herbicides. 39

40

41 Mr. Jay Wesley of the Fisheries Division of the MDNR then addressed the Board and other

42 persons present. He indicated that MDEQ manages lake treatment programs and issues permits

43 for the same. He indicated that the MDNR may on occasion give recommendations to MDEQ.

He indicated that he was present to answer questions pertaining to impacts on aquatic wildlife.

Supervisor Stoneburner noted that the Board had received a number of letters from property 1 owners opposing or supporting the proposed project. He indicated that copies of these letters had 2 been provided to each Township Board member, except for a letter from Andrew Porritt that had 3 4 been hand delivered just prior to this meeting. Mr. Porritt's letter had been made available to each Board member for review. Supervisor Stoneburner noted that Mr. Porritt, Joe Gabos, Janis 5 Laurens (2 letters), Bernard and Lori VanderPloeg and George Hoffman had submitted letters 6 opposing the project. He indicated that Mr. Greg Denenfeld had submitted two letters in 7 8 opposition to the project. A letter was also received from Koert Howlands expressing concerns 9 regarding the proposed project. Supervisor Stoneburner indicated that the Board had received letters supporting the project from Randy Klinger, Joseph and Lana Langone, Frank and Nancy 10 Spitters, Alisa and Greg Heidrich (2 letters), Patricia and Harold Pope, Steve and Carol Nemeth, 11

12 Nick and Erin Vitellaro and Benjamin and Elizabeth Simon in support of the project.

13

The Supervisor then opened the hearing to public comment. Mr. Troy Sage indicated that he opposed the project. He indicated that it could not be guaranteed that the program would get rid of the weeds. He expressed concern about the effect of the chemicals upon fish. He indicated that grandkids and a rake are the best approach to controlling the milfoil. He indicated that he was concerned about the effect of the treatment program upon the environment.

19

Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that there is no permanent solution to the Eurasian milfoil problem. He indicated that the manufacturer and his company do guarantee the effectiveness of Sonar and the proposed treatment program. He indicated that Sonar breaks down and does not cause an environmental problem. He indicated that it would not, however, permanently eradicate Eurasian milfoil and that further treatment may well be needed in the future.

25

26 Mr. Frank Spitters indicated that he and his wife have lived on Pine Lake for 4 years. He indicated that they have experienced a very significant Eurasian milfoil problem. He indicated 27 that he has spoken with a number of other lake residents regarding this matter, including having 28 29 conversations with Mr. Joe Gabos. He indicated that he has also attended a number of meetings at which a PLM representative was present. He indicated that there is definitely a problem and 30 the question is one of how best to solve the problem. He noted that people from other lakes have 31 come to some of the Pine Lake meetings and indicated that the PLM treatment programs on their 32 lakes have been successful. He indicated that he believed Mr. Tomaszewski has the best answer 33 and that it has worked for other lakes. 34

35

Mr. Koert Howland indicated that he was opposed to the project. He indicated that the proposed Sonar treatment is too aggressive and that there should instead just be a program of targeted spot treatments. He cited Houghton Lake as an example of where a targeted program had been used. He indicated that there may be other weeds that are also a problem and that would require a different treatment method. He indicated that reliance upon a spring survey is misleading in that nature species become more abundant later in the season and that they are keeping Eurasian milfoil at a 10% level later in the year.

43

44 Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that his company had performed both a spring and a fall survey. Mr.

45 Howland indicated that he would like to see that fall survey.

1 Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that Houghton Lake had used a Sonar treatment originally to bring 2 the Eurasian milfoil infestation level down. He indicated that in his opinion just relying on spot 3 treatments would not be sufficient.

4

5 Mr. Howland indicated that he believed there were other ways to control the Eurasian milfoil 6 without a whole lake treatment of Sonar. He indicated that he believed it was important that the 7 Township Board understand the facts before it proceeds.

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9 In response to a question from Trustee Grundy, Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that the proposed 10 treatment program was targeted at controlling Eurasian milfoil, which is a problem in Pine Lake. 11 Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that he believed that reliance just upon a spot treatment program 12 would be difficult to effectively accomplish when the Eurasian milfoil infestation has reached 13 the point that it is at on Pine Lake.

14

Mr. Jay Wesley indicated that the MDNR had conducted a non-scientific survey of Pine Lake 15 and that he had participated in this. Mr. Wesley indicated that this was a visual survey 16 conducted from a boat. He indicated that he and his division prefer to avoid whole lake 17 treatments because of concern that it can adversely impact native vegetation and aquatic wildlife. 18 He indicated that he must acknowledge, however, that if Sonar is used properly, killing of native 19 vegetation and adverse impact on aquatic wildlife can be avoided. He indicated that he, 20 however, prefers spot treatment. He indicated it must also be acknowledged that the MDEQ 21 allows Sonar treatments. 22

23

Ms. Joanna Haneckow inquired as to whether it was true that approximately 135 acres of the 660 acres of Pine Lake has milfoil. Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that this would appear to be correct based upon rough calculation. He indicated that 47 of the 56 lake segments that had been surveyed had Eurasian milfoil. Ms. Haneckow indicated that almost all of the Pine Lake shoreline has a milfoil problem.

29

Mr. Andrew Porritt noted that it had been indicated that the MDNR prefers a spot treatment program. He indicated that there are also environmental concerns in terms of aquatic wildlife.

- Mr. Wesley indicated that the chemicals proposed for use in the proposed program have been approved by the MDEQ for use. He indicated that copper sulfate, which is used to treat algae, is more of a concern than Sonar. He indicated that if significant amounts of lake vegetation are destroyed in a treatment program, this can cause oxygen depletion problems.

Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that he has been involved in hundreds of Sonar treatments and has never had an environmental problem. He indicated that he has never experienced an algae bloom problem from using Sonar.

41

42 Ms. Jacki Dalke indicated that there is a greater environmental concern with the current situation 43 in which individual property owners are dumping chemicals in the lake to try to treat the 44 Eurasian milfoil problem around their lakefronts. She indicated that it would be better to have 45 one comprehensively managed treatment program.

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- 2 In response to a question from Mr. Jim Parker, the Township Attorney indicated that the Township has no authority to charge outside boat owners for use of Pine Lake. 3
- 4

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Mr. Koert Howland indicated that the 2012 survey conducted by PLM had a fewer number of 5 samples than the survey performed in 2007 and did not meet the MDEQ guidelines. Mr. 6 Tomaszewski indicated that the survey conducted by PLM in September of 2012, as opposed to 7 8 the less formal spring survey, encompassed 126 sites. He indicated that this satisfied MDEQ 9 standards. He indicated that this latter survey conducted in 2012 had been specifically conducted 10 for permitting purposes.

There being no further public comment, Supervisor Stoneburner closed the public hearing. 12

In the Township Board discussion that followed, Mr. Tomaszewski indicated in response to a 14 question from Trustee Grundy that in his opinion the prospects for success of a spot treatment 15 program would be much more unpredictable than the treatment program recommended by PLM. 16 Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that use of Sonar would result in a much greater chance for 17 successful treatment of the Eurasian milfoil problem. Mr. Tomaszewski further indicated that 18 the plan prepared by him did budget for the possibility of another Sonar treatment in 2016 if it 19 was needed. He indicated that neither PLM nor the MDEQ would support this further Sonar 20 treatment if it was not needed. Mr. Tomaszewski further indicated that if only a spot treatment 21 program is used, it would result in much more treatment and the placement of more chemicals in 22 23 the lake.

24

Treasurer McGuire indicated that she lives on Upper Crooked Lake, which is subject to a 25 Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that milfoil will never be 26 continuing treatment program. permanently eradicated. He indicated that Upper Cooked Lake has 5 exotic plant species in it, 27 not just Eurasian milfoil. Treasurer McGuire indicated that the treatment program has improved 28 29 Upper Crooked Lake. She indicated that she believed it was important to go with a company that has a good record. 30

31

In response to a question from Trustee Goebel, Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that 2-4D is one of 32 the chemicals used for spot treatment, but that it cannot be applied near a shoreline. Mr. 33

Tomaszewski indicated that contact herbicides only provide a short term fix. 34

35

36 Clerk DeVries inquired as to whether there would be a problem with getting the permit application to the MDEQ in time. Mr. Tomaszewski indicated that this should not be a problem. 37

38

39 The Township Attorney noted that a series of resolutions had been prepared for the Board's consideration in case the Board determined that it wished to proceed with the special assessment 40 project. The Township Attorney indicated that the Township Board was not legally obligated to 41 proceed with the project and that the Board also had discretion to defer making a decision until a 42

later date if it so wished. The Township Attorney then reviewed the first resolution that had been 43 prepared.

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The following Preamble and Resolution were, upon motion, submitted by Trustee Goebel,
 supported by Trustee Grundy, for adoption:

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RESOLUTION ON PINE LAKE AQUATIC PLANT CONTROL PROJECT SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 12-1.

8 WHEREAS, the Township Board of the Township of Prairieville received petitions signed 9 by the record owners of lands constituting more than fifty percent (50%) of the total area of the 10 proposed special assessment district and determined both on the basis of the petitions and its own 11 motion to proceed under the provisions of 1954 PA 188, as amended, to secure plans and 12 estimates of costs together with a proposed special assessment district for assessing the cost of 13 the proposed improvement and to schedule a public hearing upon the same for this date, and; 14

WHEREAS, the plans, petitions, estimates of costs and proposed special assessment district were filed with the Township Clerk for public examination and notice of the within hearing upon the same was published and mailed in accordance with law and statute as shown by affidavits pertaining thereto on file with the Township Clerk, and;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the aforesaid notices, a hearing was held on January 7, 2013, commencing at 7:30 p.m. and all persons given an opportunity to be heard in the within 22 matter; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the foregoing, the Township Board believes the project to be in the best interests of the Township and of the district proposed to be established therefore.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That this Township Board does hereby determine that the petitions for the PINE
 LAKE AQUATIC PLANT CONTROL PROJECT SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO.
 12-1 were properly signed by the record owners of land constituting more than fifty percent
 (50%) of the total area of the hereinafter described special assessment district.

2. That this Township Board does hereby approve the plans for the project as prepared and presented to the Township Board and the estimate of cost for the completion thereof of Two Hundred Twenty Seven Thousand One Hundred Thirty Five Dollars (\$227,135).

38 3. That this Township Board does hereby create, determine and define as a special 39 assessment district to be known as PINE LAKE AQUATIC PLANT CONTROL PROJECT 40 SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 12-1 within which Two Hundred Twenty Seven 41 Thousand One Hundred Thirty Five Dollars (\$227,135) of the cost of such improvements shall 42 be assessed according to benefits, against the following properties identified by parcel number 43 below:
